

# Creating the Narrative Using Teacher Evaluation to Tell Your Story

Most school districts in Texas have adopted the state-recommended appraisal system as the process to appraise teacher performance. This instrument is the **Texas Teacher Evaluation** and **Support System or T-TESS**. Other school districts are implementing locally-developed teacher appraisal instruments; and others have adopted the **Professional Development Appraisal System (PDAS)**, which was the state recommended teacher appraisal instrument prior to the **T-TESS**.

Teacher evaluations exist for any number of reasons; however, the primary purpose must focus on improving teacher performance - the very practices and behaviors that are critical to student learning, achievement, and success. This represents the most significant reason for teachers to actively engage in their evaluation process. Your future success as a teacher rests almost entirely on your appraisal and you owe it to yourself to participate in the process and adopt a pro-active mindset rather than remain in a reactive mode. No one is better suited to tell the story of your classroom than you are. So, do it!

This third generation of teacher evaluation in Texas is intensive; to that end, rather than build a lot of information into this survival guide, we are providing links to access information about **TESS** and the **PDAS**. The information for **T-TESS** includes information developed by the **Texas Education Agency (TEA)** and **TSTA** and the **PDAS** information has been developed by **TEA**.
