



# SBEC rulemaking related to HB3 implementation

Several provisions of House Bill 3, the school finance and tax reform bill passed during the recent legislative session, fall under the purview of the State Board for Educator Certification. The following table includes the subject and purpose of each piece of HB3 that SBEC will be crafting rules for, the existing or new Texas Administrative Code rule that is affected, and the current schedule for completing the rulemaking process.
